# What We Achieved in 2022

#### Successful completion of the Shelf Richmond Birdwing Butterfly Project

#### **Commencement of a new regeneration project at Kinabalu Drive**

TM Landcare have entered into an agreement with the Queensland Government to regenerate a large weedy block between Kinabalu Drive and Wongawallan Rd

Regeneration of a large area adjacent to the Scouts Clubhouse off Hartley Rd

After the eradication of weeds, hundreds of trees have been planted in the area behind the Landcare Centre and below the soccer field at the Sports Grounds.

### **Continuation of the ongoing Privet Removal Project**

Large trees have been removed at the Showgrounds' northern boundary.

#### **National Tree Day at Rosser Park**

40 community volunteers planted 350 trees on 31<sup>st</sup> July.

#### Maintenance of more than 15 reserves and parks on Tamborine Mountain

... with the assistance of contractors and volunteers.

### Partnership with the Sports Association to eradicate weeds beside the Parkrun track

The very weedy area behind the playing fields is well worth regeneration, since it adjoins the nature reserve which runs along the escarpment behind the Sports Grounds.

#### **Privet Removal Project**

The remaining privets along the southern fence line at the Showgrounds will be removed in March.

#### Maintenance at our many sites, including the Shelf

This is key to a successful, enduring outcome for every regeneration project.

#### Ongoing work by our great Tuesday Team of volunteers
