The recent sale of books and plants at the Shed at our Landcare Centre was enormously popular with locals, who carried off bags of bargains for winter reading. The sale netted \$2,000, which will contribute to our forest restoration projects.

Our Ongoing Weed Removal and Regeneration Activities

Our contractors are doing great work in clearing invasive weeds from many sites. These include:

- The Parkrun Track at the back of the Sports Ground

- Tamborine Mountain Road near Skywalk
- Brahman Road Reserve
- Kinabalu Drive
... where a large swathe of invasive weeds have been removed, and planting is progressing well for this three-year regeneration project on State Government land.



- Tamborine Mountain State School, where four very large invasive coral trees (*Erythrina indica*) have been removed from the carpark area. This area will be planted out with native shrubs.



Fostering Environmental Learning

We are liaising with the three local state schools regarding environmental programs for students, including visits to our Landcare Centre, and assisting with the Schools National Tree Day planting in July.
